Retiring? AZ Dept. of Education invites contractors to keep building the future as teachers

Reporting about the state of the construction industry workforce often cites the alarming statistic that, for every five construction workers leaving, only one is joining the industry. And with nearly 1 in 4 construction workers older than 55, the need to recruit new talent is urgent.

The Registrar of Contractors (AZ ROC), in its mission to promote quality construction in Arizona, is helping to address this critical need through its annual Construction Science Technology Apprenticeship Fair, in partnership with the D-backs (returning to Chase Field in April); through its collaboration with Governor Hobbs' BuilditAZ Apprenticeship Initiative, and by spreading the message at every event we attend that construction is an honorable and rewarding career pathway that offers opportunities for paid hands-on-learning.

If you are a contractor nearing retirement, AZ ROC and the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) invite you to consider how you may continue to contribute your expertise to the industry by moving from the worksite into the classroom. Future generations need to know how to do it right and how to stay safe--can you help?

A message from the AZ Department of Education:

Hello contractors, thank you for building the roads and structures we utilize daily. When you are ready, Arizona needs your building experience in the classroom to enable future generations to continue building within the state of Arizona.

THE REGISTRAR'S REPORT



Greetings! The Arizona legislature is back in session, and your ROC is active. Our primary focus is on A.R.S. § 41-3024.04, known as the "sunset" statute, which mandates the ROC's termination on July 1st, 2024, if not continued. Additionally, statutes in Title 32, Chapter 10, are set to be repealed on January 1st, 2025. This process aligns with regular legislative oversight that all state agencies are subject to, required every 10 years; our last review was in 2014.

Currently, we've completed a self-audit and have filed HB 2091 for our agency and statute continuation (thanks to our bill sponsor Rep. Laurin Hendrix - D14).

We received recommendations for 8 years from the House Commerce Committee and 2 years from the Senate Government Committee. The next steps involve the assignment of our continuation bill to a House committee for a hearing. We'll keep you updated on our progress as we strive to uphold our tradition of serving Arizona's citizens and the contractor community since 1931. We anticipate continuing this legacy into the foreseeable future. Thank you for your consistent support!





Heat Map**








