





ACI Aggregate Level 1
Testing Technician Certification

This is a two day program that includes two sessions: the classroom review session on Friday morning and hands-on practice during the afternoon and the written and performance exams on Saturday morning. The package price includes the review, the exams, all certification fees and the ACI workbook for this program (CP-44).

An **Aggregate Testing Technician** – **Level 1** is an individual who has demonstrated the knowledge and ability to properly perform, record, and report the results of basic field and laboratory procedures for aggregates. It is the responsibility of the Technician to obtain copy of the ASTM standards required for this program. Please note, Certification is NOT TRAINING. It is the responsibility of the Technician to obtain adequate training and exposure to the practices before coming to take the exam.

- T21 / C40 Organic Impurities in Fine Aggregate for Concrete




