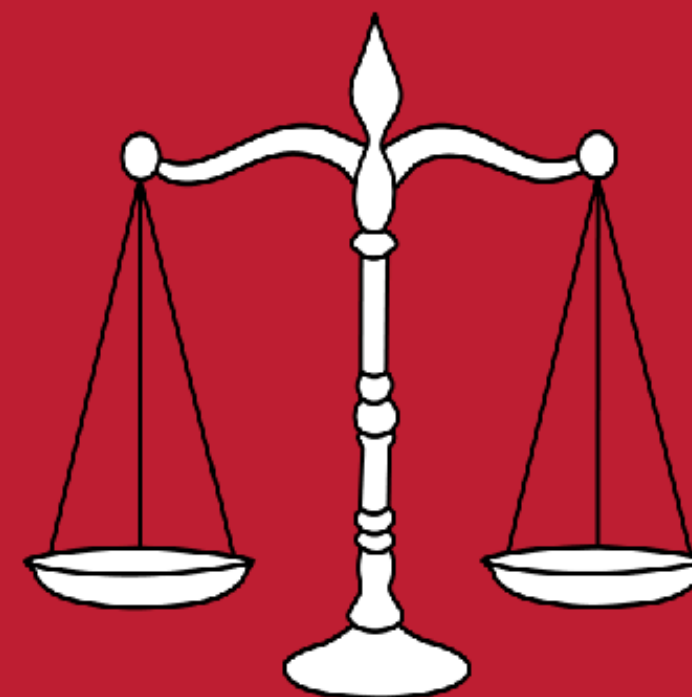

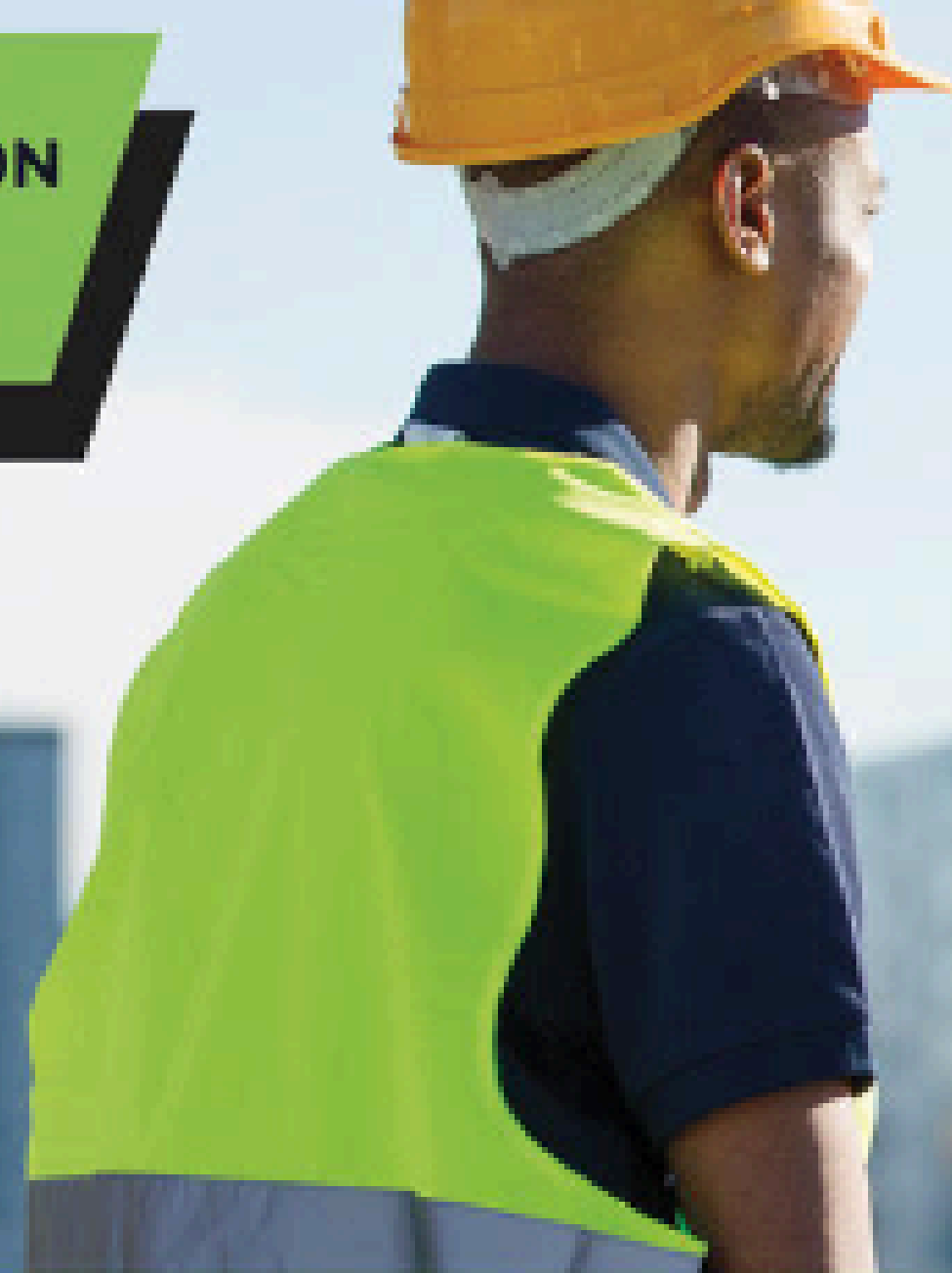

- Encourage natural growth, flowering, and dormancy of trees, shrubs, and ground covers
- Rejuvenate plants that have outgrown a space

- Improve the health and structural integrity of trees and shrubs

- Common landscaping hazards and avoiding them

Turf Care and Installation

- Turfgrass varieties used in the desert southwest

- Mechanical steps to properly install sod
- Proper cultural practices: mowing techniques, thatch removal, aerification, fertilization, and irrigation for turfgrass varieties
- Overseeding and spring transition
- Problem solving strategies for common turfgrass diseases and pests

ACI Aggregate Level 1 Testing Technician Certification

This is a two day program that includes two sessions: the classroom review session on Friday morning and hands-on practice during the afternoon and the written and performance exams on Saturday morning. The package price includes the review, the exams, all certification fees and the ACI workbook for this program (CP-44).

An **Aggregate Testing Technician - Level 1** is an individual who has demonstrated the knowledge and ability to properly perform, record, and report the results of basic field and laboratory procedures for aggregates. It is the responsibility of the Technician to obtain copy of the ASTM standards required for this program. Please note, Certification is NOT TRAINING. It is the responsibility of the Technician to obtain adequate training and exposure to the practices before coming to take the exam.

Scope and Knowledge

- T248 / C702 - Reducing Samples of Aggregate to Testing Size

- T27 / C136 - Sieve Analysis of Fine and Coarse Aggregates
- T85 / C127 - Specific Gravity and Absorption of Coarse Aggregate
- T84 / C128 - Specific Gravity and Absorption of Fine Aggregate
- T255 / C566 - Total Moisture Content of Aggregate by Drying
- T21 / C40 - Organic Impurities in Fine Aggregate for Concrete

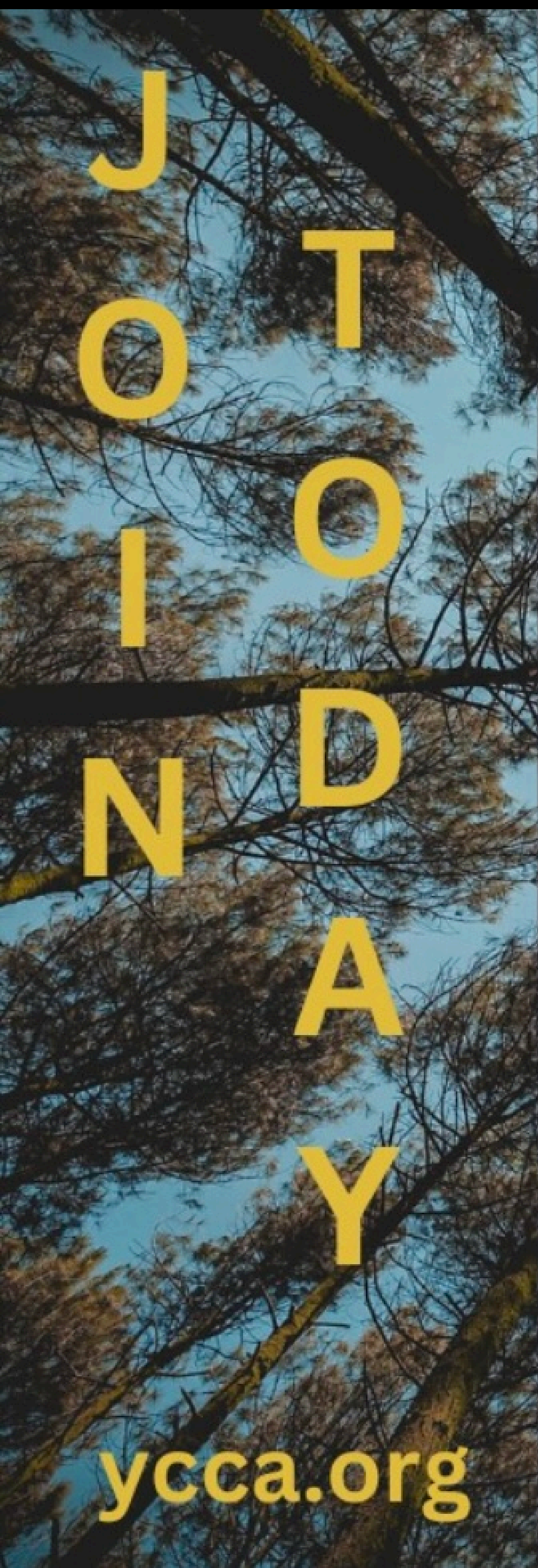

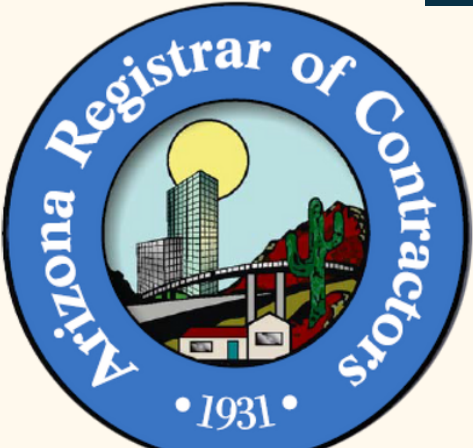
