

GOVERNOR KATIE HOBBS HIGHLIGHTS PLANS FOR OPPORTUNITY, SECURITY, AND FREEDOM FOR EVERY ARIZONAN ON ARIZONA PROMISE TOUR

PHOENIX, AZ (February 7, 2025) — Since launching the Arizona Promise Tour, Governor Katie Hobbs has traveled across the state fighting for her legislative priorities that will restore the Arizona Promise and expand opportunity, security, and freedom for all.

Governor Hobbs began the tour in southern Arizona, visiting the Tucson Electrical JATC, where the BuildItAZ Initiative has bolstered apprenticeship programming, creating new opportunities for working class Arizonans. She also stopped in Sahuarita to highlight the over \$100 million she has delivered to local law enforcement to support border security efforts.

During a visit to the Lincoln Learning Center, an on-site childcare provider for the John C. Lincoln Honor Health Hospital Campus, Governor Hobbs highlighted her plan to cut child care costs by two-thirds. She spoke with parents about the life-changing access to childcare and with employers who emphasized the impact it has on strengthening the <u>workforce</u>.

As we continue to monitor the 57th First Regular Session, I would like to provide an update on our bill, HB2483 (Registrar of Contractors; Licensure). Unfortunately, the bill was held in the House Commerce Committee on Tuesday, February 18th.

Please note that Friday, February 21st, was the final day for bills to be heard in committees, and we will continue to monitor the legislative process closely.

In addition to our legislative efforts, we are continuing to prepare for the Director Nominations Committee in the Senate, where nominees for the Director positions of state agencies and departments will be evaluated and potentially confirmed. The first DINO hearing took place Thursday, February 20th in the Senate DINO Committee.

While we are still awaiting further details on when my hearing will be scheduled, we kindly ask for your support in this process. If you are able, please consider sending letters of support for my nomination as Director of the Arizona Registrar of Contractors. I am truly grateful to those who have already submitted their letters — your support means the world to me. ROC 2024 Study on Commercial Contractor Deregulation

Laws 2024, Chapter 2024, Sec. 6 requires the Arizona Registrar of Contractors to compile a report on commercial contractors to determine whether opportunities exist to statutorily remove ROC oversight of the commercial contracting profession. In accordance with this mandate, the Arizona Registrar of Contractors officially completed and submitted the Deregulation Study on commercial contractors to leadership in both the House and the Senate on December 31st. 2024. The feedback received was invaluable in helping shape a comprehensive and informed evaluation. A sincere thank you is extended to everyone who took the time to complete the surveys sent out a couple of months ago, as well as those who helped distribute them.








Be Part of Arizona's Reentry Initiative!

To create safer communities and lower recidivism rates, <u>Arizona's</u> <u>Workforce Reentry Program</u> provides inmates nearing the release from prison with employment and life skills to be successful upon reentry into our communities.

In 2017, ARIZONA@WORK Second Chance Centers opened in State prisons to help inmates prepare for success in the workforce. Since then, Reentry workforce services have expanded into parole offices, reentry centers, and community partner centers.

BENEFITS FOR YOUR BUSINESS

Employers report that in addition to <u>Work Opportunity Tax Credits</u>, free <u>Federal Bonding</u> and other financial incentives derived from hiring ex-offenders, they benefit from staff who are highly motivated and loyal.

Reentry Workforce training provides participants with 8 weeks of employment readiness activities including soft and hard skills development, resume and interview preparation, workforce retention training, onsite vocational training and much more.

Steps to Protect Yourself

- It is important to stay informed about common scams. Share this information and your knowledge of scams with others.
- Never give personal information over the phone.
- Use secure passwords and monitor bank accounts regularly.

• Discuss any suspicious offers with family or trusted friends. How to spot this happening to an older adult:

- Unexplained changes in behavior or mood.
- Increased secrecy about financial matters

The newest trend is "romance scams." Throughout the meeting we discussed some of the latest scams the attorney general's office is seeing. One common concern was also contractor scams. The ROC Outreach Coordinator Maggie Roby and Investigator Dale Tupper discussed ways to make sure you are hiring a licensed contractor and ensuring they are not just trying to scam you out of your money.


