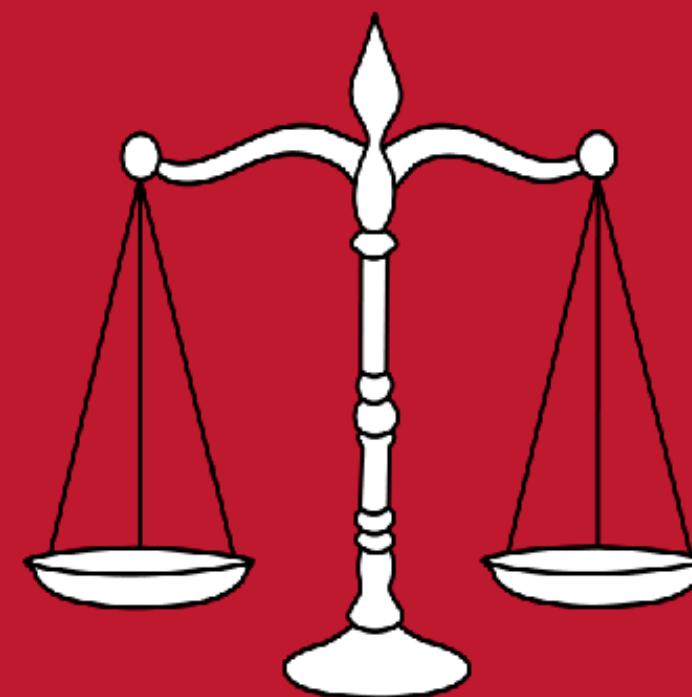

Maricopa County Industrial Development Authority Invests \$500,000 to Support Sustainable Home Improvement Lending in Maricopa County

Phoenix, Ariz. (December 2, 2024) – The Maricopa County Industrial Development Authority (MCIDA) has announced a significant \$500,000 investment in Sustainable Home Improvement Loans of Arizona (SHILA), the state's first nonprofit Green Bank focused on providing affordable financing solutions for low- and moderate-income homeowners.

"Maricopa County is committed to fostering economic growth and supporting sustainable communities for all residents," said Maricopa County Supervisor Clint Hickman, District 4. "By investing in SHILA, we are helping low- and moderate-income homeowners access affordable financing options for energy-efficient improvements that will lower their utility bills, renovate their homes, and improve their overall quality of life. This partnership not only strengthens our local economy but also contributes to a more resilient and sustainable future for Maricopa County. We are excited to support SHILA's work and the positive impact it will have in our community."

With help from MCIDA, SHILA is poised to help over 425 Maricopa County residents with \$5 million worth of energy efficiency projects over a three-year period. With an average project size of \$12,000, SHILA's work will help families reduce their energy expenses through insulation, roofing, door, window, electrical, and HVAC upgrades.

"We are honored to receive this foundational investment from the Maricopa County Industrial Development Authority," said Ty Lorts, CEO of SHILA. "With their support, we can start making home improvement financing accessible for families who need

it most. This funding will allow SHILA to begin transforming homes across Maricopa County, helping residents access a healthier living environment, lower utility bills, and have a greater quality of life."

The MCIDA's investment in SHILA aligns with Maricopa County's goals to support sustainable community development, job creation, and increased home affordability.

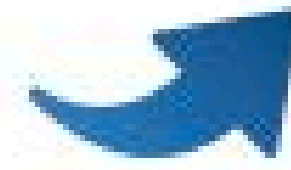

SHILA provides a solution by enabling residents to maintain and improve their homes without facing the financial burden of high-interest loans or costly financing options. - **Proven concept:** SHILA has a licensing agreement with Solar and Energy Loan Fund that will provide underwriting and loan capital. They have been operating as one of the country's oldest green banks for 14 years.
- **GGRF deployment:** SHILA will be positioned to help deploy the millions of federal dollars the state of Arizona has been designated for residential energy efficient upgrades.

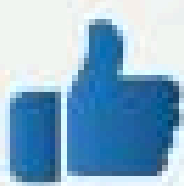

- Provide employers with a written report summarizing findings; and
- Provide safety and health training.

Consultants will not:

- Issue citations or propose penalties for violations of ADOSH standards.

FREE ON-SITE SAFETY AND HEALTH SERVICES FOR SMALL BUSINESS

Serving the Small Business Community -
The Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health (ADOSH) provides free and confidential safety and health training to any size business committed to improving workplace safety and health.

WHAT IS A CONSULTATION VISIT AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

A consultation visit is a voluntary activity conducted at the request of an employer. The employer's only obligation is to correct any serious, unsafe or unhealthful working conditions discovered by the consultant within a reasonable time frame.

- **Request for Services.** The consultant discusses the employer's specific needs and sets a date for a visit that is convenient to both the employer and consultant.
- **Initial Meeting.** The consultant arrives at the worksite for the scheduled visit and conducts an opening conference with the employer and employee representative to explain the consultant's role and the obligations of the employer.
- **Walk-through.** Together, the employer, employee representative, and the consultant examine conditions in the workplace and the consultant evaluates potential hazards, physical work practices and the employer's safety and health management program.
- **Closing Conference and Follow-up.** The consultant reviews detailed findings with the employer and employee representative in a closing conference. The employer will learn not only what improvements are needed but also what is being done right, as well. Following the closing conference, the consultant sends the employer a detailed written report explaining the findings and confirming any abatement schedules.
- **Correcting Hazards.** When a situation is determined as a serious hazard, the consultant will assist the employer to develop a specific plan to correct the hazard within a reasonable time frame. In rare instances, where the consultant finds an imminent danger situation during the walk-through, the employer must take immediate action to protect workers.

Changes to the Concrete Design Standard

This presentation combines two topics regarding updates to two of ACI's reinforced concrete design standards, ACI 318-25 "Building Code for Structural Concrete—Code Requirements and Commentary" and ACI 562-25, "Assessment, Repair, and Rehabilitation of Existing Concrete Structures—Code Requirements and Commentary."
